## **General Preferences - Period Closing Date**

## **Overview:**

Order Time has a field called Period Closing Date. This field will allow you to "lock" Order Time Transactions prior to the set date by preventing Edits and Deletions of Posting Documents by Date.

## Solution:

A new feature in Order Time is a setting to prevent Order Time users from being able to make changes to Posting Documents on or before a specific date.

To reach this setting.

- Go to the Admin page by clicking your company's name in the top right corner.
- Click Company Preferences in the Settings section.
  - 1. Next click the General section
  - 2. Then click the Advanced tab
  - 3. Now click the Period Closed Date field and enter a date for when you stop the ability to make changes to Posting Documents in Order Time
